

# **Exploring Our Website**

Our club bylaws were recently revised to reflect our new 501c3 tax exempt status and to form a new committee to help our club run more efficiently. Read through the bylaws so you will know how much work goes into providing the activity you so enjoy. Please take a close look at the committees, especially our new Club Dances Committee. This committee will plan how to make hosting our dances more efficient and less of a burden to any one person. If everyone does a little, no one has to do a lot. Consider joining this, or any committee. A little of your time helps us all have a great time square dancing all year.



Make It A Point . . . to Touch hands at the end of each call..

This may mean just a tap as you pass through the end position of one call and continue moving to start the next call.

Tapping/holdings hands after each part of a more complex call, like the SSD call Grand Square or Load the Boat in Plus, is also essential. These touches or hand holds help everyone see the

formation and their position in the formation and in the square. You must always know who your partner is and if you are a center or an end. It's hard to do a Partner Trade if you don't have a partner because you're not holding hands. If you don't form and see the line by touching hands, you won't be able to find the center for a Cast off 3/4.

Don't skip the hand taps/holds because you know where you are, what you are doing and what to do next. Others in the square may not. Someone in the square may be momentarily lost and that hand tap could help them find their way back into the call. Remember this is a team sport. Each dancer should know what to do but each is equally responsible to do what is needed to help the others on your team.

Every time a new line is formed be sure all dancers immediately join hands. In lines, maintain hand holds while executing "Forward and Back", with only the ends tapping hands, then you will all be ready for the next call and not have to find the line again. Again, think of that pesky Cast Off ¾! That center hand hold is important.

During the pandemic and ZOOM dancing, we learned how much we depend on others in the square. "Connecting" with the other dancers makes square dancing easier and more fun!

Always something to learn 😂

### **Delegates Connect Clubs with MCASD**

Each club has two Delegates that represent their club at MCASD General Meetings, held in September, December and April. The delegates learn what MCASD is doing to help clubs in the area and report this back to their clubs. The General Meetings are a two-way street where delegates can share what their club needs from MCASD. Here are a few recent examples of how MCASD has implemented club ideas:

- MCASD's "UCanSquareDance" program has brought in many new students to area clubs via the <u>Ucansquaredance.com</u> website.
- Smaller clubs expressed their needs that are now being discussed in a Small Club/Banner Committee.

Glenview Squares submitted an idea regarding the Sweetheart Dance timing and theme that was approved by the MCASD Executive Board. The idea involves moving the early spring regional dance from February to late March in order to include people still taking lessons. As a result, MCASD will test the concept by hosting a 'Spring Fling' on March 30, 2025 in place of the Sweetheart Dance. The Spring Fling's SSD hall will include student level and SSD tips.

### MCASD & You

Club members and club leaders are always welcome to attend both the General Meeting and the Executive Board meetings. General meetings take place in person while Executive Board meetings are hosted on Zoom.

Dancers can also become active on the MCASD board. Each year we hold elections for the officers. The MCASD president can also appoint board members. New members bring a fresh look at issues along with ideas.
